Distributed Learning

Coast Mountains School District will have course offerings in distributed learning for students in K-12.



Homeschooling

This is an alternative method of teaching where the parent delivers an educational program to children at home. Parents must register their homeschooled children by September 30, 2020.

parent involvement is different for each choice:

Brick and Mortar (Traditional school)

- This is school at the school building
- It is run as per the way schools have always been run
- Teachers in classrooms with students
- Sanitation and COVID safety measures in place
- Teachers teach, design the assignments and the assessments as well as reporting to parents
- Upon completion of Grade 12 a dogwood diploma is issued
- Parents support learning by:
 - making sure students attend and are actively involved by supporting the learning in the classroom
 - o attending meetings,
 - reading reports and newsletters,
 - o checking in with teachers,
 - talking with students about what they are learning

<u>Distance Learning also known as Distributed Learning</u>

- Program is delivered through the school district Distance Learning program
- The school district is committed to lending some on reserve support to students who live on reserve and register for this program
- Learning is self paced (no time lines)
- The lessons come from a teacher who connects with students electronically
- No face-to-face meetings with the classroom teacher; it is a totally electronic classroom (not remote/virtual learning)
- Learning is self-paced (no time lines)
- Assignments are submitted and corrected by the teacher
- Parents work with students to keep up the pace of the learning
- Students need to be monitored by parents in terms of:
 - Attending scheduled calls
 - Doing the assignment
 - Submitting assignments in a timely manner
 - Maintaining a regular learning schedule at home

Homeschooling

- Arrangements for homeschooling are made by the parents directly with the Ministry of Education
- Parents will teach the lessons and be responsible for designing the assignments,
- Parents assess all student work
- The school district does NOT provide any instruction
- This program is the full responsibility of the parent. It is not supervised by a certified teacher.
- This program is not required to meet provincial standards and is not inspected by the ministry of education
- Families are only connected with a school in that they are able to borrow books from a school
- The school district is not responsible for lessons, assignments, or assessment.
- This program does <u>NOT</u> result in a dogwood certificate at the end of the Grade 12 year.
