Dear CMSD82 Parents, Guardians and Caregivers,

Welcome to the 2021-2022 school year! I hope this letter finds you and your family happy, rested and eagerly anticipating a positive and engaging school year. Your children will be welcomed into our schools on September 7 regardless of where they are at academically, physically, socially and/or emotionally.

With greater community protection against COVID-19, schools can return to closer to normal operations, with some prevention measures continuing to be in place to keep schools as lower risk settings for communicable disease transmission. While COVID-19 is present in our communities, there will continue to be COVID-19 exposures in schools and cases amongst students and staff. Because cases in schools reflect those in the community, these are more likely to occur in communities with lower vaccination uptake. Children continue to be a low risk for serious outcomes from COVID-19, including variants of concern detected in BC.

For your information, we take this opportunity to share links to the <u>Ministry of Education Return to School Announcement</u> of August 24 and the updated <u>COVID-19 Public Health Guidelines for K-12 Schools</u>.

Together, we can make 2021-2022 a safe and productive year. We will be asking for your support in this regard. You can do your part by:

- Getting vaccinated;
- Conducting the daily health check for your children prior to sending them to school;
- Keeping your children home when they are sick;
- Following the requirement for all students in Grades 4 to 12 to wear a mask while indoors, including at their desk and on school busses, and encouraging Kindergarten to Grade 3 students to wear a mask.

Coast Mountains School District 82 and its individual schools have developed Communicable Disease Prevention Plans. These plans outline safety procedures to help prevent the transmission of COVID-19. These school plans will be posted to the school district's website at www.cmsd.bc.ca and to school websites in the coming week.
